CHAPTER I.8

RRBIOT c.I.8.

1. In exercise of the power in that behalf vested in him by section 28 of the Interpretation and General Provisions Ordinance 1993, the Commissioner hereby delegates to the Commissioner's Representative the Commissioner's authority and powers to appoint Customs Officers pursuant to section 3(a) of the Imports and Exports Control Ordinance 2009.

2. For the avoidance of doubt, this delegation shall not preclude the Commissioner from himself exercising the powers or discharging the duties set out in paragraph 2 whenever he sees fit.
